GUEST SPEAKER: Les Hollingsworth

Les Hollingsworth, the Director of the University of Wisconsin Platteville College of Business was introduced by his father-in-law, Ron Weier. Les attended Luther College where he met his wife, Lindsey. He joined the National Guard at was stationed at Camp McCoy where he helped train people from places like Nicaragua, China, and Brazil. Les went on to earn his master's degree. He has taught at various locations including the University of Phoenix.

Les uses stories to help his students realize that education is life changing. He tries to find ways to reduce the cost for the students and was able to provide \$53,000 to freshman students this year and \$40,000 to students working towards their master's degrees. Business classes aren't emphasized nor are the various aspects of business understood at the high school level. He is conducting a recruiting event this spring to develop more interest in business degrees.

He went on to discuss the success of the college of business at the university. The business department is half the size of the mechanical engineering department. He is trying to recruit students from places like Loas, Germany, California. The Platteville students work with these students to develop a partnership that will hopefully encourage some of them to remain in the community. Other areas these students explore are finance, economic development, work with non-governmental organizations, public safety, and marketing.

The club enjoyed the positive interactions he is encouraging in his department to develop strong relationships and job opportunities for the students after graduation.

Dr. Michael Black, Associate Professor of Statistics at the University of Wisconsin-Platteville, was introduced by Kevin Haertzen. Dr. Black earned his PhD in Statistics from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Prior to earning his PhD he worked as an actuary for six years in Minneapolis, MN. His primary areas of interest include probability, general statistical consulting, and actuarial studies. In his spare time, Dr. Black collects comic books.

Dr. Michael Black referenced many renowned mathematicians including Julian Havil, Martin Gardner and Hans Freudenthal during his presentation. In the December 1979 issue of *Scientific American*, Martin Gardner wrote a puzzle that he deemed "impossible." Dr. Black shared with us the Excel worksheet(s) that he built out to attempt to solve this puzzle, shared pieces of his thought process behind building it, and offered some reasonings behind his results. Though most of us got lost along the way (see visual aids below), we thoroughly enjoyed Dr. Black's presence and presentation.
