BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING REPORT: President Crofoot reviewed the following summary of the Governing Board Meeting held on August 30, 2022.

TREASURER'S REPORT for Period Ending 08-31-2022: (Submitted by Duane Borgen, Treasurer)'; President Crofoot noted the Internal and Youth Account balances contained in report, highlighting the Joker Fund Balance (included in the Internal Fund). Crofoot advised that a motion was made by the Board to approve the report as printed. Paul Budden seconded this motion, which carried unanimously.

COMMITTEE UPDATE HIGHLIGHTS:

- Finance Committee -
 - Budget Process: It was noted that Duane Borgen has sent out the "Donation Requests" forms to agencies and requests are due back by Sept. 15th.
 - Optimist Dues Increase: President Crofoot noted that the Board has made a motion to the Membership "to increase regular members' dues by \$6 effective October 1st, with the remainder of the \$15 OI dues increase to be absorbed by funds from the Club's Internal Account". This would make member's dues \$90 and spouse dues \$84. President Crofoot also noted that the FOO membership dues will be increased to \$140. Board's motion was seconded by Ken Kamps. A lengthy discussion then took place, ending with a subsequent motion made by Jerry Schewe, seconded by Tim Boldt, to table voting on the Board's motion until the next weekly meeting on Sept. 9th. Motion carried. Prior to next week's meeting, a breakdown of dues (i.e., what goes to OI, SWIS, what is retained by Club, etc.) with the Board's proposed increase recommendation, as well as what it would be if the members are charged the additional \$15 in full will be sent via email to members.

• Community Service -

- PCA Trail Clean Up Day Sept. 17th from 9-11 a.m.: The joint project with Kiwanis and Rotary members scheduled for Sept. 17th. A sign-up sheet was circulated.

- Fair Report: Becky Schambow reported that our fair income was slightly less compared to last year's, She noted that some donations were received including 10 cases of water from Mast Water, 6 cases from Jordan Holthaus, and several rubber mats for the trailer from Bob Hundhausen. She and Alaina Reeves thanked all Committee members and volunteers for their efforts.

Youth Activities -

Story Book Walk: It was reported that Terri Ellis has agreed to co-coordinate this program with Carley Borcherding. Carley will continue to store the materials at her home, but Terri will help recruit volunteers to set up books in strategic locations periodically. President Crofoot reported that the Board made a motion "to reassign this project from the Youth Committee to the Community Service Committee". Hearing no objection, it was felt that this motion did not need a vote as Committee Guidelines and assignments are not policy, but guides. Amy Coffey and Linda Foht volunteered to help with this project.

New Business:

- **Project List:** President Crofoot noted that he and Becky have been working on updating our project list that will be submitted to upcoming President, Melissa Palfrey for approval. This is needed for OI Insurance purposes.

BUSINESS MEETING BREAKOUT: At this time, a motion was made by Jerry Schewe, seconded by Charlie Clark, to go into a "Business Meeting" for the sole purpose of discussing and voting ON DUES INCREASE TABLED FROM Business Meeting on 9-2-2022. Motion carried. (Speaker followed the business portion or meeting.)

• OI Dues Increase – Board Motion: President Crofoot noted that the Board had made a motion to members "to increase regular members' dues by \$6 effective October 1, 2022 with the remainder of the OI's dues increase to be absorbed by funds from the Club's Internal Account". This had received a second at the Sept. 2nd Business meeting by Ken Kamps, but then after discussion, it was tabled due to members wanting to see breakdown. Subsequently President Crofoot created a spreadsheet which was sent via email to membership, and copies circulated at this meeting. After a lengthy discussion, a call for vote on the Board's motion was taken and motion failed. Jerry Schewe then made a motion, seconded by Ken Kamps "to increase Regular Members dues to \$100, increase Spouse dues to \$90, and decrease Lifetime memberships to \$66. Motion carried.

TODAY'S GUEST SPEAKER: Kevin Hall – Platteville Produce Auction: Today's speaker was recruited and introduced by Maggie Kleisath.

Kevin Hall was born and raised locally in the Catholic religion. At age 18 he converted to being a Mennonite, married a Mennonite woman, moved to Pennsylvania and then moved back to Platteville. Kevin is now the Manager of the Platteville Produce Auction facility.

This cooperative business was originally initiated by Amish and Mennonite farmers who came together to develop a program that would allow them to better utilize their acreage on something other than "that of milking cows". They currently have 75 shareholders with 85 different growers who bring their produce into the facility for auctions which are held every Tuesday and Friday. Produce is fresh picked and sold at reduced rates in bulk. He noted that sometimes stores buy bins of produce from them and that any item considered "spoilage" goes to people who have pigs for their feed.

TODAY'S SPEAKER: Ken Kamps – History and Interesting Facts About Our Club

Ken was introduced by Charlie Clark who noted Ken was a Professor at UW-Platteville in the Department of Education from 1963 to 1998 and was a Founding Member of our Club. What prompted Ken to do some

research for his talk today began in June when Melissa Palfrey (President Elect) asked him if he knew when our Club purchased the mine train for the local museum.

Ken's presentation provided a wealth of history information noting the Platteville Optimist Club was formed in 1968. The first meeting place was at Steve's Pizza. Through his research reading old "Rooster Call" weekly bulletins he noted that in 1974 Richard Brockman suggested we buy a mine train. By selling note cards with pictures they were able to purchase the train in 1977.

The first Optimist Club (not in Platteville) began in 1916, and the first Optimist convention was held in 1919. In 1924 Optimists were known as a "Friend of the Boy". This was later changed to "Friend of Youth".

In 1974 the Platteville Optimist Club began to have our oratorical contest. In 1973 the "Mystery Greeter" was added to Club's meetings. In the fall of 1974, it was proposed that the Club allow women to join.

Ken remarked on some of the activities sponsored by the Club including: teen dances at the Armory and collection of used magazines for nursing homes in the 70's; providing safety devices for cupboards, "Pass-Dribble & Shoot", and bike safety in the 80's.

Past fund raisers were noted as well including White Elephant Sales (where the "Shell Lamp" came into existence. Between the years of 1974 and 1990 the Club sold pizzas, had brat sales and pancake breakfasts. Cheese curd sales began in 1978.

Social events began in 1970 with outings to UW and high school plays and then "Pick and Net Ball" (similar to Pickleball).

NOTE: Bulletins formerly known as "Rooster Calls" can be found on our Club website. During initial months of Covid Pandemic (beginning March 2020) meetings were not held. In June of 2020, "Monthly Highlights" were instituted in lieu of the weekly Rooster Calls. These "Monthly Highlights" are posted on our website and contain a summary of weekly meeting information. Becky Schambow will send out a link to the "Monthly Highlight" site to members as the highlights are posted.

program. Participants logged 7585 books read this summer.

GUEST SPEAKER: Erica Davidson - Impact Life

Erica Davidson was introduced by Charlie Clark. Erica is the Recruitment Development Coordinator for Impact Life (formerly known as Mississippi Valley Blood Center). Every year Impact Life teams up with thousands of donors and hundreds of community partners to help save lives through blood drives and their collection centers. Their goal is to have a sustainable blood supply for those in need.

The organization supplies approximately 125 hospitals in WI, IA, IL and MO, including our local Southwest Health.

They partner with education leaders via a life-saving grant in which they can go into schools to talk to students about blood donation. She noted a school can receive a \$250 grant by hosting a blood drive.

She noted a blood transfusion occurs every two seconds in the US and that one pint (unit donated) saves up to three lives.

She encouraged members to donate blood and encourage others to do the same.

GUEST SPEAKER: Members Terri Ellis and Maggie Kliesath, joined by Dwight Klaassen – Platteville Chorale and Children's Choir Update

Displaying an interesting power point, speakers Terri Ellis, Maggie Kleisath, and Dwight Klaassen provided information about the history and progression of the "Platteville Chorale" and the "Platteville Children's

Choir". The power point not only provided key information about the organizations, but displayed pictures that were taken over the years.

The speakers noted they have all been involved with these programs for many years, with Dwight being a Charter Member of the Chorale.

The Platteville Chorale was organized in the fall of 1975 and began rehearsals under the direction of Gerald Darrow. Initially there were 36 singers, and their first performances were in November of that year.

In the spring of 1978, the Chorale Board planned and organized a Summer Music Festival which had a 16-year run.

The Chorale has often joined with University Singers and other musical organizations in the community to provide concerts throughout the years. The Chorale has traveled on tour with other organizations including the United Kingdom in 2014, and Montreal and Quebec City in 2018.

The "Platteville Children's Choir" was established in 1989 by the Platteville Chorale. This program has grown remarkably over the years, having three different choirs for grades 2-4; 4-6 and 6-8. Although the Covid pandemic greatly affected the PCC's ability to be able to sing together, they are now back in full swing and expect continued growth as they continue to "develop the whole child through the chorale singing process".
