GUEST SPEAKER: EILEEN MCCARTNEY, PLATTEVILLE AREA PICKLEBALL ASSOCIATION:

Eileen McCartney, our fellow Platteville Optimist, is retired from Platteville School District where she taught health and physical education. She now teaches exercise classes twice a week at the senior center and has been an avid pickleball player since retirement. Before COVID, she played 3x a week.

Eileen began by explaining the sport of pickleball but was most excited to share the plans for a pickleball court complex coming to Platteville. The proposed complex will be developed on the corner of N 2nd St. & Pitt St. in Platteville, neighboring the recently completed Broske Center. The location will be convenient for community members as well as students of the Platteville Middle & High schools. Driven by the eagerness to have a true pickleball court close to home, she and a group of pickleball enthusiasts have been fundraising for the future outdoor, 8 court complex. Eileen shared some photos of local pickleball players hitting the makeshift courts in town, as well as her own grandchildren who have developed a love for the sport as well. In the beginning stages of Eileen's fundraising mission, her granddaughter went to her room and came back with a few dollar bills as a contribution, which meant a lot to Eileen. Having raised \$260,000 so far, the Platteville Area Pickleball Association (a.k.a., PAPA), is \$40,000 away from their fundraising goal of \$300,000. GUEST SPEAKER: DR. JASON THRUN, UW-PLATTEVILLE, INTRODUCED BY KEVIN HAERTZEN

Dr. Jason Thrun has been teaching math for over 25 years and has been at UW-Platteville since 1998. Lately, he has been interested in outreach within our communities, working with Engineering students to create mobile math exhibits for students to use in the Tri-State area.

Dr. Thun visited Hamburg, Germany in 2016 to attend a math conference, ICME 13 (International Congress of Math Education." While on the campus, he was initially intrigued by a building that appeared to have lots of foot traffic, called the Popular Building. When he entered, he discovered it was a building full of math exhibits: some interactive, some independent, some family sized. These mobile exhibits included probability demonstrations, bridges, puzzles, etc. and belonged to a larger museum in Giessen, Germany, called The Mathematikum. Upon his return to the U.S., he wanted to do the same. So, he assembled a team of Math Department Staff, students & staff working in labs, student helpers, the art department, and more. As they put their heads together, they were able to come up with and create their own math exhibits. On their team member wish list, he added, are people with welding skills to help build certain exhibits. Since they've started, they have participated in events such as Dr. Grunow's Family Math Night, the Dubuque MATHCOUNTS competition, the UW-Platteville math contest, and the engineering expo. Their criteria for puzzles is that it has to have some sort of math connection. The students don't need to understand it at the time, per se, but their hope is for the students to be able to speak about it with their teachers later, or come to understand it later and provide an opportunity of enrichment for the kids. Although they began working on this project in 2016/2017, they've been taking exhibits to local schools for about 2 years. So far, they have had

events in Dodgeville, Mineral Point, Darlington and Highland. Their hope, eventually, is to schedule full day events in local communities.

GUEST SPEAKER: DR. MICHAEL BLACK, UW-P STATISTICS PROF., INTRODUCED BY KEVIN HAERTZEN

Dr. Black has been with UW-Platteville since the Fall of 2013 and teaches Statistics. He earned his PhD at University of Nebraska-Lincoln, and prior to that, he worked as an actuary in Minneapolis. He has two daughters and two sons, ages 16, 14, 12 and 10. His wife, Tammy Black, is an architect in Platteville.

Dr. Black began his presentation by stating you should not gamble unless: 1. You have a predetermined amount of disposable funds you can use. 2. You can keep track of your wins and losses religiously. 3. You will stop when the predetermined amount of disposable funds run out (or before). He also noted different types of financial gambles: casino games, card games, lotteries, investments, insurance, etc. He explained that we can calculate the probabilities of winning the Powerball lottery by using the hypergeometric distribution. He also shared there is such a thing as "lottery fatigue," but noted that's a whole different lecture. Along with a lot of numbers and probability explanations, Dr. Black explained why you will never win the Powerball jackpot, as well as why no one you've ever met will win either. He explained that for each Powerball ticket drawing, if one saved the equivalent amount in a Roth IRA (currently \$2 a ticket), after a long-term annual return of 7%, one would have about \$1million after 84 years. He also touched on his journey from actuarial science to statistics and academia, stating that he got into statistics because he likes probability, and that an actuary is an accountant with no personality.
