Serving as Second Vice President in 2016-2017, Barb Stockhausen will serve as First Vice President for 2017-2018. Barb joined Platteville Optimist




Our Second Vice President is Becky Schambow. Joining Platteville Optimist in 2014, Becky served last year as a Board Member.
