<u>Program:</u> Thanks to Eileen Engelke, we had the pleasure of welcoming John-Paul Butcher as our guest speaker this morning. John-Paul is a graduate of UW-Stout Bachelor in Art Education. He received his master's degree from Kearney, NE. John-Paul taught one year in Yuma, CO, five years at Iowa-Grant, eight



years at Osseo-Fairchild and has been with the Platteville School District for the past 3 years. He teaches art at elementary, middle school and high school levels.

John-Paul provided a handout, highlighting his presentation on "The Hillmen Art Connection". The purpose of this program is:

\*to promote the 1<sup>st</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grade(s) art department

\*bring recognition to our students

\*fund the art department

This program was introduced by John-Paul and has effectively achieved all three purposes. There are currently 27 local businesses that support the program financially and there is a waiting list of businesses that are waiting to join in. The donation of \$200/year from participating businesses provides funding to purchase necessary art supplies, which previously was paid for by students. Throughout the year, 33 pieces of art, designed by students are

displayed in these local businesses. Art work rotates throughout the businesses, thanks to the many parent/teacher volunteers. John-Paul personally notifies parents as to the location of student artwork and he, along with other school faculty, decide which artwork qualifies for display. The bio of John-Paul included the following statement which I found to be powerful and inspiring. Time was allowed for questions.

"I am an <u>Innovative Art Educator</u> who strives to be the best at what I do. I continually push myself to go the extra mile and to give my students nothing less than a <u>QUALITY</u> art education. My ultimate goal is not only to touch the developing minds of young students...but to inspire <u>GREATNESS</u> in them as well!
