Guest Speaker:

Kathy Buhr, Director of Strategic Philanthropy & Schmitt Island Development with the DRA. Born & raised in SW Wisconsin (Louisburg). Bachelor's degree in Business from UW-Platteville. Held numerous positions in SW Wisconsin and Dubuque, including Director of Sales & Catering at the Governor Dodge Hotel & Convention Center, Marketing Analyst with UW-Platteville, Advertising Account Manager with Boyd Gaming, numerous positions with Q Casino through the years. Currently lives in Hazel Green with her husband Vic and children Kathryn (Junior at Southwestern) and William (Freshman at Cuba City), oldest daughter Claire is a sophomore at UW-Platteville.

Kathy shared a great video highlighting how the Dubuque Racing Association once revived Dubuque in the 1980s, as well as their efforts to rebrand as they near the finishing line of greyhound racing. During the early 1980s, the City of Dubuque's population had declined by 10% and unemployment was the highest in the nation – eventually influencing an infamous billboard in Dubuque, stating "Last One to Leave Town, Turn off the Lights." In response to this turmoil, The Dubuque Racing Association was formed to provide jobs and bring people back into the community.

Ms. Buhr also spoke about Q-Casino, a partner of DRA, surprising many of us with the fact that this casino is one of two non-profit casinos in the country. Approximately 1/3 of their revenues are paid to the City of Dubuque, 1/3 goes to charitable giving, and the remaining 1/3 goes to the Schmitt Island Development Fund. Kathy also shared that 30% of Q Casino's revenues come from Wisconsin residents, a recognition which has opened their eyes to the critical importance of giving back more to Southwest Wisconsin communities. After recently onboarding President & CEO Alex Dixon, the organization completed a full philanthropic review this past year identifying ways to refresh the application process, communities to increase support of, etc. As it stands, the Gaming Industry is the #2 Income Generator in the State of Iowa (not agriculture, etc.).

The Dubuque Racing Association will soon close its doors to the long-standing greyhound racing tracks, but the organization is not going anywhere. In fact, this transitional time has launched them into an exciting and successful rebrand to ensure their ability to support in big ways for generations to come. In response to the 1980s "Last One to Leave Town, turn off the Lights" campaign, they currently have billboards up stating "We Are Still Here, Turning Up the Lights." We thoroughly enjoyed Kathy and Will's presentation and look forward to seeing their impact grow into our nearby communities!

Guest Speaker:

Melissa Palfrey introduced our speaker Terri Slapak-Fugate - Director of Emergency/Urgent Care at Southwest Health Center.

Terri has worked for Southwest Health since May of 1992 when she and her husband moved to Platteville to raise their children. Terry has worked for Southwest Health in a variety of roles and in February 2012 she accepted the position of Director of the Emergency Department/Urgent Care at Southwest Health where she helped establish our area's SART (Sexual Assault Response Team) program in 2013 with the help of people at Southwest Health Center, grants, and donations.

Terri's informative talk covered the development of the improvement of care for people needing to deal with sexual assault situations at Southwest Health from her first experience to the way the SART program works today. Prior to the SART program victims didn't have an advocate working with them and checking up on them afterwards. Her description of one of her experiences left her feeling cold as they just read the directions to the kit during the exam. A patient said she felt her experience was like an oil change. Prior to the program, law enforcement wasn't sure what their role was and tried to see patients in a timely manner and if not possible sent them to Meritor in Madison. All pediatric cases are still sent to Madison.

At Southwest Health, Terri continues to encourage more to become involved in the SART program and encourage involvement and comfort level with medical personnel, law enforcement, and legal professionals. The program serves Grant, Iowa, and Lafayette counties with some calls from Crawford County. When Terri gets a call she explains her role, observes the patient, and focuses on what is best for the patient and works to obtain services and support quickly. She feels communication is best for effectiveness and checks back with each patient within a week. She is President of Family Advocates and uses this role to find support advocates for her patients.

Terri is very proud of the record of their team and has received good comments from people she has worked with. She has been involved in about 100 investigations and only one went to court but wasn't prosecuted even though there was evidence. She can help locate information any time after the investigations with the extensive database she has set up. She plans to continue building the program and encourage others to become part of the SART team and expand the services available.

Erin Isabell, a graduate of the University of Wisconsin Platteville is the Youth Services Manager at the Platteville Library for the past 30 years. She works with families, students, and children from birth to 17.

Erin's enthusiastic presentation explained the association of her department with the three reading programs supported by the Optimist Club to serve the youth in our community.

Books for Babies provides families of newborn babies with a packet which includes a board book, information about the Books for Babies Program, letter, and brochure from the Optimist club, and reading suggestions for the library. She helps Fern Nall order the books for the program.

Story Walk, another national program, which was established with the help of Carley Borcharding. They choose books to cut apart, laminate, and display on posts for people to walk by and enjoy at their leisure. Purpose is to encourage people to enjoy the outdoors. The library has 13 books ready to display or check out for your use. She shared with us one which was written, illustrated, and published by librarian Lydia Sigwarth called, Dear Librarian. The story walks are displayed at various schools, Katie's Garden, and other places.

The Summer Reading Program establishes ways to encourage reading and participation at the library through the summer. The list of programs set for this summer looks very interesting.

During the pandemic, as everywhere, supply chain issues and increased cost for materials have affected these programs.

The Library Board has tried to encourage more people to come into the library by lifting all fines on the books that are returned in good condition. Erin said that they have seen an increase of people returning overdue materials and entering the facility without feeling guilty about the fines. Patrons are still responsible for the cost of damaged books and books from other library systems. Another way the library is trying to get out into the community is with the Book Bike which the foundation purchased 2 years ago. The bike is taken out to events like Music in the Park and around town.

Thanks to Erin and the library staff for continuing to be creative and make sure there are many opportunities to read in our community.
