- **President's Goal:** As noted at our last Business Meeting, President Reeves has a goal to: determine how we can fine-tune our policies to: determine how to proceed when donation requests pose questions amongst the group; how to keep members informed fairly; how to conduct anonymous polls; and how to maintain consistency in our grant responses.  Today's Speaker: Tammy Salmon-Stephens, Director of UW-Platteville's College of EMS Student Success Programs was recruited and introduced by Kevin Haertzen.

Tammy has worked at UW-Platteville since 1997. A UW-Platteville Alumni, Tammy holds BS and MS degrees in engineering and is actively involved in programs to support women and underrepresented minorities in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics) and student success. She is the recipient of several awards related to diversity and inclusion, specifically related to Women in STEM. She focuses her project management and communication skills on programs and events that improve student success in higher education, specifically through coaching, mentoring, teaching, identify discovery and development, diversity, inclusion, and self-care. Most notable is her leadership to increase access for women in STEM careers, improve processes, remove barriers to success, and improve communication processes. She is the co-advisor for the UW-Platteville National Society of Leadership and Success student chapter.

Tammy stated that the reason she does what she does is that STEM and diversity are important to her and she feels by helping diverse students it helps the whole. With a history of being an engineer, she felt avoided and wondered if it was because she was a woman in engineering.

She provided examples of barriers students faced in getting their degrees and how they overcame those barriers leading to their success. She noted it is important to her to provide opportunity to help students and felt that if you have the right support, you can reach your goals.

He noted he grew up in Seattle, where it rains "all the time". He stated the expression "didn't your mom teach you to come in out of the rain" didn't work in Seattle as they played in the rain all the time. He remembers having a 13" black and white TV until he was 12, when they got their first color TV and it had five channels.  Today's Speakers: Speakers Joe Boremann, Director of UW-Platteville's Huff Family Innovation Center and Mason Lobliska, Prototyping Coordinator for WiSys/VentureHome at UW-Platteville were recruited and introduced by Kevin Haertzen.

Joe has 18 years of Career Technical Education experience, and he specializes in construction, metalworking, and engineering at the secondary level. Recent roles include managing a Maker Space, educating at-risk students and staff in technology for enhanced learning. Joe's dedication to authentic education is reflected in projects such as a gridless tiny house, and the development of the Multi-disciplinary architecture and engineering curriculum for the APEX program. Joe is in his second year at the Huff Family Innovation Center, supporting the growth of Prototyping Services, Membership Services, training and ensuring a safe and user-friendly space.

Joe noted the Huff Family Innovation Center is open to everyone. There are community memberships available to use the facilities at the Huff Center. Their main focus is students, and his priority is to keep people safe and the space accessible. The Center has a robust safety training program with courses on various pieces of equipment. Beyond training and safety, they support prototyping services. Joe stated that people with ideas reach out to them, asking for help in determining how they can make their projects happen.

In the past year, Joe reported the Center had 70,000 visits. The Center has 20,000 square feet and is so special there are only two other universities in the US with similar services that Joe was aware of.

Mason Kobliska is the Prototyping Coordinator for WiSys/VentureHome and the Huff Family Innovation Center, tasked with developing a more robust and active prototyping service at the University of Wisconsin – Platteville. With prior experience in engineering, manufacturing, and business, Mason worked on a composite fabrication startup called Kratotech. Holding a provisional patent through WiSys for his chopped fiber composite pump, Mason is determined to help others pursue innovative concepts. Now, he assists students, staff, and budding entrepreneurs in bringing their ideas to life using the resources at the Huff Family Innovation Center.

Mason talked about how he works to help those with ideas take the next steps, including prototyping, approaching start-up companies, and facilitating resources available to build the actual product.
