GUEST SPEAKER: Jen Collins, UW-Platteville

Introduced by Ron Weier, Jen Collins spoke to us from the UW-Platteville School of Education. Jen is a passionate advocate for rural schools and has been working diligently within her department to improve the experience

and education offered to students who will go on to teach in rural communities. UW-Platteville has been educating teaching for 150 years, though their focus has not always been what it is today. In the past, curriculum was designed for "preparation everywhere" as opposed to "preparation *somewhere*," which is what Jen and her colleagues have been trying to change. In this case, that "somewhere" is rural, which is so different than urban education that it deserves its own curriculum. What's unique about rural education, Jen shared, is the importance of community and the fact that they suffer in funding which makes it hard to recruit teachers who have received higher paying job offers in more urban areas. In effort to tailor their curriculum to rural areas, students are required to take a course on community-based learning and the School of Education is delivering coursework on "ruralness." Jen was energetic and fun to hear from, and she encouraged us to go see the timeline mural in Doudna Hall highlighting education from 1866 to Present Day.

GUEST SPEAKER: Jim Boebel, Platteville School District.

Melissa Palfrey introduced Superintendent Jim Boebel, who is in his 26th year in education and 3rd year working as the Platteville School District Superintendent. Jim provided an update on where the schools, students and staff are at for the year. Prior to the school year starting, the administration had some goals: to improve their ability to serve every student in terms of inclusion, to be recognized nationally as a professional learning community, and to ensure they can work in-person with students. To work towards their goal of inclusion, they partnered with The Center for All (Oshkosh, WI – CESA 6), who performed an equity walkthrough in Neal Wilkins to point out things in the classroom that might not make a student feel welcome. Jim touched on the concept of "initiative overload" which is caused when teachers and staff feel the need to implement too many ideas at once. To combat this, he worked with staff to identify a small number of priorities to focus on for the year. Acknowledging the controversy surrounding mask mandates in schools, Jim explained that some school districts choose to require masks right off the bat (Platteville being one of them) which certainly causes more friction, and other school districts choose the "wait and see" approach. Implementing the mask mandate was an effort to be able to work in-person with students, and Jim noted that the masks are helping kids stay in school. As an advisor of Jim's illustrated: "waiting to implement masks is like pumping the breaks after you've wrapped your car around a tree." We surely appreciated Jim's presence at our meeting and wish him the best for this school year!

Melissa Palfrey introduced Darlene Masters (Executive Director) and Paula Schoenfield (Outreach Services) from Family Advocates. Darlene shared that Family Advocates has been in the area since 1982. Originally being a "private" or hidden shelter, the home is now public and is located at 250 N Court St. in Platteville. Darlene and Paula conducted an activity with the Optimist members which was designed to illustrate the many hardships that their residents have faced before coming to them for help. Each Optimist member received a pouch of tokens: some teal and some purple. Members had to choose where they were going to stay after deciding to leave a dangerous home situation (often driven by what they could afford with their tokens). Locations to stay and their costs were: Hotel (two teal tokens), Friend's house (two purple tokens), Shelter (1 purple), Apartment (3 teal), homeless (free) and staying at home in an abusive situation (free). The activity opened our eyes wide to the people Family Advocates helps and the situations they come from.
