GUEST SPEAKER: Ryan Simmons, Platteville Fire Chief

Ryan Simmons joined the Platteville Fire Department in 2001 after participating in Platteville's Citizen Academy program, following the footsteps of his dad and grandpa, who volunteered for the fire departments in Platteville and Belmont, respectively. Ryan became the Assistant Chief of the PFD in 2010, and he was appointed Chief in 2014. Outside of fighting fires, Ryan enjoys spending time outdoors and with friends. Ryan discussed the decline in volunteers over the years, the work he does as the full-time fire chief, and the conversation surrounding the need for a larger facility. Since volunteering has declined, Ryan and the full-time fire inspector handle the little calls during the day to keep the volunteers for when they really need them. A few years ago, they began surveys to anticipate and determine the need of an expansion. Aside from the obvious space improvement, they are looking forward to improved safety, cancer preventative measures (i.e., a diesel exhaust system in the garage which they currently do not have), increase washer/dryer space to wash their gear (only have one currently), and bathing facilities to be able to obey the rule of thumb: "After a fire, change of clothes and shower within an hour." The projected \$13million project has kept them busy writing grants; notably, they received an \$8million grant from Ron Kind, who selected this project to receive federal funding. As far as location is concerned, they've discussed the following: expand the existing, the Armory, or O.E. Gray. The study determined O.E. Gray would be the best location, and the school district sold the property to the City of Platteville for \$1. They are in the process of determining a place for the existing tenants of this building, including considerations of having it be a joint building.

GUEST SPEAKER: Amy Seeboth-Wilson, UW-Platteville

Amy Seeboth-Wilson earned her Master of Science in Urban and Regional Planning from UW-Madison and a Bachelor of Art in Anthropology from Lawrence University. Prior to joining Platteville, she was a planning manager for Southwestern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission, leading a nationally-recognized sustainability initiative, developing bicycle and pedestrian plans, and researching market opportunities for local food production.

Amy spoke about the sustainability efforts at UW-Platteville. She shared that as the current generation values environmentally sustainable causes, the University's sustainability efforts give them a competitive edge over other schools. Some of the environmentally friendly efforts at UW-Platteville include: the largest grid-free solar in US higher education, transformative & hands-on learning about sustainability, a commitment to zero waste by 2035, 300+ acres of nature on campus (including the mound), student-grown foods served in dining halls, and the most rural fixed-route bus service in Wisconsin. Speaking to the 2.4 Megawatt d.c. Solar Array that they are currently working on, this array will offset their electricity by 17%. The array will be the 6th highest producer of Renewable Energy on a higher education campus after Luther College & Morris University. She also touched on other efforts UWP is making including their "Pioneer Restore" waste processing operation, which can be found on uwplatt.edu/department/pioneer-restore. Amy's energy was a great way to start our day!

GUEST SPEAKER: James Schneider, Grant County Community Development Agent

James Schneider is the Grant County Community Development Agent and came to speak to us about Grant County's work force for the future of Grant County. He started by sharing a story about an organization he is apart of called "Warm Showers," where he hosts cross-country bicyclists at his home to shower and sleep as they make their way across the country. He had a couple young individuals staying with him the night prior to our meetin and he was amazed by their go-getter attitude and work ethic. Contrary to the lack of faith that many have of today's workforce, James stated that as far as the future work force goes, we are in good hands. He shared a quote he once heard: "It ain't right, it ain't wrong. It's just different" and encouraged us to try to catch people around us doing things right.

James noted that 60% of those we graduated high school with live 50 miles or more away. Some things to do to keep our area well-populated are: Invite people! Reach out, ask, make people feel welcome here. Moreover, reach out to people that are not like ourselves. What makes the difference is *relationships*. We very much enjoyed having James speak!

GUEST SPEAKER: Jessie Lee-Jones, Platteville Public Library Director

Jessie has been the Platteville Public Library director for the past 6 years and spoke about the challenges and changes they overcame during the pandemic.

Deemed a non-essential business in the wake of the pandemic, the library was closed to the public from March to June of 2020. The staff, however, still showed up ready to work. They made "Take & Make" kits for patrons to pick up, went behind the scenes and documented lots of SOPs (in case of retirements, etc.), ran lots of reports, and cleaned up their data base. In June 2020, they began curbside pick-up and access to computers. Before letting the public back in, they removed lots of furniture, took out all the little kids' toys, and began wiping books down. She mentioned that in the future they'd like to keep the practice of wiping books down, only offering it as a volunteer opportunity. Currently, their

hours have expanded but are not back fully, which is due to a staff capacity issue that they are working to address. They have the "Book Bike" that they take around town to events like the Farmer's Market, Music in the Park, and outdoor book clubs. As for the future goes, they are hoping to know more by the end of August. The permanent open hours change is inevitable, as it hasn't been sustainable even pre-pandemic (they studied stats on when people were using the library and there are very little people using it at 9:00 a.m. or 7-8:00 p.m.). Jessie Lee-Jones thanked us for all of our support over the years. We very much enjoyed her presence at our meeting!
