TODAY'S SPEAKERS: Jessica Kuhn and Randy Grailer from Astrea Internet Service

President Palfrey introduced today's speaker Jessica Kuhn who is the Director of Sales with Astrea. She's been with the company for 13 years and aids in the overall growth and customer satisfaction for Astrea. She then introduced Randy Grailer who is the Sales Manager.

Together Jessica and Randy talked about Astrea which has been in business since 2006 and serves 65 communities throughout WI and the UP. About one year ago Astrea began to put infrastructure throughout Platteville which is the largest project they've done so far. They stated they understand small business and small communities and have a strong sense of customer service. They are developing a work force and are trying to hire service reps that reside in our community. They also are invested in our community and have joined the Chamber and are active in community events. Another generous investment in our community is the fact that they will be providing Family Advocates with free internet service. Their reliable and high speed internet service has a built in redundancy, subsequently they stated that any outage should be resolved in less than one day.

TODAY'S SPEAKERS: Leon Neuheisel and Hap Daus – Sleep in Heavenly Peace Program Update

Leon Neuheisel and Hap Daus, Club members and today's speakers needed no introduction. Both are avid wood workers who came together in 2021 to establish the Grant County chapter of Sleep in Heavenly Peace. SHP is an organization with 314 chapters nation-wide that together have delivered 124,000 beds since being

founded in 2012. Since inception of the Grant County Chapter in 2021, 150 beds have been delivered throughout Grant County and they have not found everyone yet! They deliver a complete bed: frame, mattress, bedding, and pillow to 'some of the happiest kids you've ever met'.

Hap and Leon shared some impactful stories about their experiences with delivering beds, a very heartwarming deed. One parent shared that her son slept 10 hours the first night he had his bed. Another parent shared that their daughter, aware that her bed would be delivered that day around 3 p.m., sat, waited and eagerly watched out the window for the delivery since 8:00 that morning.

Most monetary donations received go towards lumber to build the beds, and they have received several handmade quilts and blankets as well. They tend to have a great turnout for bed build volunteers, but could use more delivery volunteers during the winter months. Although literature is sent out through schools, it's been noted that not all kids or parents can read well enough to fully understand what SHP might do for them – so sharing this great mission verbally is a profound way we can be of service to the organization. Likewise, they are very willing to help chapters get started in the surrounding Lafayette and Iowa counties, so spreading the word to members of other communities could be a helpful way to get those chapters started.

TODAY'S SPEAKER: President Palfrey - Optimism and a Walk Through of Club's Website
