#### GUEST SPEAKER: Jen Schweigert & Nicole Tyc on Cardiovascular vs. Strength Training

Jen Schweigert has owned Snap Fitness for 12 years, is a past Board member of PCA and current Board member of Platteville Community Fund. Nicole Tyc is a mother of 5 children, ages 7,6,4 and 2, and with her "free time" she is a personal trainer at Snap Fitness and recently became a doula.

These ladies explained that cardiovascular exercise is a type of high fat burning, endurance focused physical fitness. This type of exercise is important for someone who is focused on weight loss. Types of cardio include: running, speed walking, bicycling, spin class, Zumba, HIIT, etc. They explained that HIIT (High Intensity Interval Training) is a type of cardio that will burn more calories than other types because your heart and cardiovascular system have to do more work to go up and then come down and then up, then down.

As for Strength training, this is a type of exercise focused on conditioning muscle groups and building strength. This typically burns less calories, unless it is "powerlifting." People often wonder which of these types is best for them, and although it depends on the person, Nicole said that most people would benefit from a combination of both. Jen added that although people would benefit from doing both, it's important to do what you enjoy so you keep it up.

During Q&A, some members added that although they once thought they didn't need a personal trainer, they are glad they went to Snap Fitness and learned otherwise. ### GUEST SPEAKER: Don Suloff - Nautical Charting, Airport Safety & Oceanographic Research

Leon Neuheisel introduced Don Suloff, who he met at a bed build for Sleep in Heavenly Peace a couple months ago. Don went to George Washington University and went on to work for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Association (NOAA) for 30 years. Some of the places he worked and lived were Norfolk, VA, Seattle, WA and Washington, D.C.

Don shared a little bit about himself, his work and some of the experiences he had. He grew up in the state of Oregon thirty minutes from the coast but had only visited the ocean a half dozen times before starting his career. During his 30-year career, he worked primarily with the department that provides research on international exchange data among 60 different countries (working internationally assures continuity). He spent 8.5 years on ship and 2.5 years serving airports around the country for the Federal Aviation Administration. The other 2/3 of his time was in different office environments. NOAA has its own fleet of vessels for charting, oceanographic research and fishing. The first vessel he was on was a research vessel working exclusively in Alaska. He shared that the Alaskan waters have never been completely surveyed – they are still working on it. Researching waters is very time consuming, but important to provide accurate data for other ships that will be navigating based on that data.

The last ship Don was on was a 303-ft research vessel out of Seattle, WA, of which he was the Commander. The project was a study of sea floor spreading of the Jan de Fuca Ridge, about 100 miles off the shore of Washington. This research took 3 years and consisted of measuring thermal activity, size profiling, imaging, and studying the tectonic plates. Today, researchers continue to find new information because of advanced technology. Don shared that he still gets together with his other sea mates, and when this occurs, their spouses get to listen to them swap sea stories.

GUEST SPEAKER: Erick Tomas, CCDHH (Communications Contest for Deaf & Hard of Hearing) Participant was introduced by Terri Ellis. Terri noted she had the privilege of working with Erick as a music instructor at Dodgeville, where Erick is now an 8<sup>th</sup> grade student at the Dodgeville Middle School. Terri noted Erick has a keen interest in farming and has many pets / farm animals in his care on his family's farm. Erick is active in the Boy Scouts and plays the violin in his school's music program.

After being introduced, Erick recited his CCDHH entry speech on the topic "Healing the World with Optimism". He noted three main "obstacles" that hinder being optimistic in current times, including: war, which he noted costs our nation money and resources; race relations; and pollution of our air and water systems. Erick noted solutions which he felt could "heal our world". He stated instead of war, countries should show compassion to each other and learn from past mistakes. Relative to issues with race relations, he encouraged people to spend time with different cultures, suggesting community events be held to learn about different cultures. Erick also provided suggestions to help decrease pollution in our environment by caring and doing things such as "picking up garbage". Erick supported endeavors to use electric and steam resources. Key points in Erick's presentation were that we can show optimism through kindness, noting that what we give we would get in return. Erick believes we can have a better place if we work together and make different choices. He feels we can bring hope by promoting peace, accepting each other, and caring for our planet.
