GUEST SPEAKER: Ann Bonner, Supervisor of Respiratory Care, Sleep Lab & Cardiopulmonary Rehab. Departments at Southwest Health - Sleep Apnea – What is it and how to treat it.

Today's speaker was introduced by Becky Schambow. Ann is a Registered Respiratory Therapist, and Registered Polysomnographic Technician (*sleep testing*) with 40 years of clinical experience. She has been at Southwest Health for 17 years and prior to that she was in Southeast Florida working at 2 different large hospitals in West Palm Beach and Ft. Pierce. It was noted that hurricanes in 2004 and less than optimal schools for her kids sent her north.

Using a power point that displayed facts she explained what Sleep Apnea is, what the risks are, what the signs and symptoms are, and what testing and treatment can be done. Highlights of the information include:

- Sleep Apnea is a common disorder in which you have one or more pauses in breathing or shallow breaths while you sleep. This happens when your upper airway becomes partly or completely collapsed.
- Those at risk of having sleep apnea are: any age, even children; males are a higher risk than women; being overweight; being over the age of forty; large neck size; large tonsils, tongue, or small jaw bone; family history; and a nasal obstruction due to deviated septum.
- Signs and symptoms include: snoring; pause in breathing while sleeping; waking up choking or gasping; daytime fatigue; morning headaches; not being able to concentrate; depression; mood swings / personality changes; waking up to use the bathroom a lot; and waking up with a dry throat.
- Health risks of Sleep Apnea include: high blood pressure; stroke; heart failure; heart attacks; diabetes; depression; chronic fatigue and chronic headaches.
- Sleep apnea and diabetes often have a connection, as well as heart disease / issues.
- There are written screening forms to help determine your possible risk that you can get from your provider or hospital's Sleep Lab. (Ann distributed today). If needed, your provider may order a subsequent home test and / or an in-hospital, overnight test if needed.
- The preferred treatment for Sleep Apnea is a "CPAP" device that consists of a small machine and a mask that you wear that provides "continuous positive airway pressure" to you while you are sleeping.

Joe Bormann: Past President Crofoot extended appreciation to Joe Bormann, **from Huff Family Innovation Foundation Center – UW Platteville** for coming in today to be our speaker.

Joe Bormann was introduced by Hap Daus who noted Joe Bormann is employed at the University of Wisconsin Platteville as the Director of the Huff Family Engineering and Innovation Center. Joe entered this role with 18 years of Career Technical Education experience at the secondary level.

Joe has specialized in teaching shop classes related to construction, metalworking, and engineering. Most recently his focus has been on managing a Maker Space while educating at-risk students and staff in technology that enhances learning.

Joe's unwavering dedication to making education authentic has been demonstrated in vast projects, programs, and partnerships. In addition to secondary education, Joe has several experiences working with regional businesses and private citizens as a carpenter, moonlighting as a CNC grinder operator at Bodine Electric, and tool design experience with John Deere 330 Skid Steer line at the Dubuque construction and forestry plant.

Joe's presentation enlightened members to a facility / program available at UW-Platteville that most were unaware of. The Huff Family Innovative Foundation Center is a new space that is not only for students, but can be used by community members as well *(for a monthly fee)*. The Center focuses on three "E's" being: Education, Experience, and Equipment. Students can develop prototypes, design and work on many different types of projects and assist with teaching others. Joe brought several different projects done by students that showed work with embroidery machines, laser engraving, 3-D printers, etc. One very interesting device developed by a student was a plastic crayon or pencil holder that would assist those with disabilities to be able to hold the crayon or pen in a more stable manner.

At the Huff Center there are several different production labs such as: metals lab; machine shop; sand blasting; paint booth, automotive area; and electronics.
