<u>Program:</u> Duane Borgen introduced Steve Braun, Director of Grant County Emergency Management. Steve has served as Emergency Management Director since July, 1999 and also currently serves as Fire Chief in

the city of Lancaster.

Much to everyone's surprise, Steve informed the membership that Grant County is the most disaster prone county in Wisconsin, primarily due to flash floods as has been experienced for several years. Steve explained the cycle of Emergency Management, starting with Preparedness, which includes training in many areas to multiple entities (public safety personnel, hospitals, police departments, fire departments, etc.). Response is next in the cycle followed by Recovery, which both of these take into consideration both the public and private sector. The final phase in the cycle is Mitigation, what can be done to lessen and/or prevent the impact of disasters.

Steve stated there is a regional network within Grant County and surrounding counties that partner together to address specialized needs related to various types of disasters



A Technical Rescue Trailer, utilized by the regional network, carries Equipment necessary in rope rescues, hazardous material, confined space rescue, swift water rescue, ice rescue, urban search and rescue plus others. They are working on preparedness for mass shootings, which Steve confirmed the Police Departments currently have a very effective plan in place. They are working on a plan that would supplement the local police.

Steve responded to many questions from members and stated if interested, there are many ways people can volunteer to help people in need when a disaster hits.
